The TAMUS Project offers resources for parents, children, and seniors. Parents receive interactive training modules to foster mental health, while children and youth learn through interactive resources. Seniors receive audiobooks on mental health in later life, addressing topics like understanding, combating loneliness, and promoting active ageing.
